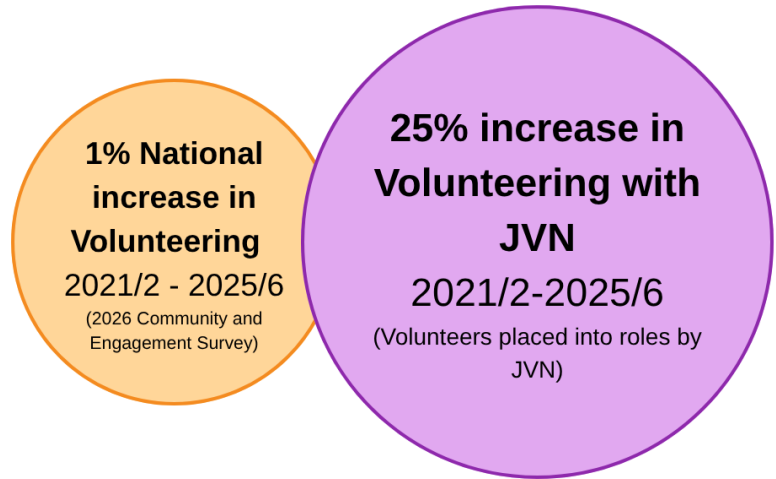
JEWISH VOLUNTEERS BEATING THE ODDS

In August, the UK Government published its 2026 Community Life & Engagement Survey. Once again, it shows that British Jews are volunteering at the highest percentage of any faith group.

At a time when national volunteering participation has fallen significantly, JVN is beating the odds and is engaging more volunteers than ever.

The Community Life & Engagement Survey saw a 1% relative increase in volunteering from 2021/22 to 2024/25.

JVN recorded a **25% increase** in volunteers in the same period.



SUPPORTING GRASSROOTS CHARITIES

JVN is a small team with a wide reach. We work efficiently by sharing expertise, collaborating closely and making the most of our systems and resources.

We support grassroots charities by providing a central place to recruit and connect with people looking to volunteer. Through our database, charities can promote their opportunities to a wide network of potential volunteers, helping them reach beyond their existing contacts and making recruitment simpler and more accessible.

JVN AWARDS 2025

JVN celebrated over **100 winners from 54 charities** at this year's Annual Awards. With the theme 'A Lifetime of Volunteering', we were honoured to present **28 Lifetime Awards** to individuals who have volunteered for over 25 years.

Natasha, a young adult with autism, received our Young Adult Volunteer of the Year Award for her dedicated volunteering, making communication cards to assist non-verbal children at Kisharon Langdon.

We had made provisions for Natasha to receive her award at her table, as her family told us she could often become overwhelmed by noise and crowds. However, when her name was read out, no one could stop Natasha running to the stage to receive her Award and give a heartwarming thank you to everyone in the room.

At the Awards, we launched our new Living Volunteer Archive. This walk-through exhibit consisted of 4 screens and 29 foamboard easels, showcasing the stories of 29 amazing individuals who have dedicated over 25 years to volunteering.

The Archive records the story of volunteers like Frank, who has spent a lifetime using his experience as a Jewish person to advocate for other marginalised groups. Starting with his advocacy in Working Men's clubs 60 years ago in Coventry, Frank has volunteered ever since and cooks for Ukrainian Refugees once a week.

LOOKING FORWARDS

In January, JVN conducted its own community survey to better understand the current landscape of Jewish volunteering and how we can respond to the changing needs of volunteers.

Responses came from a broad cross-section of the community and showed that Jewish people greatly value volunteering.

Some encouraging feedback from respondents includes:

80%

Said that Volunteering was important to how they saw themselves as a Jewish person.

95%

Said Volunteering had a positive impact on their wellbeing

70%

Could recall receiving regular emails from JVN about Volunteering

Looking to the year ahead, JVN are developing more ways to engage volunteers and support the charitable sector. These include our goals to....

- **Get volunteer opportunities in front of more than 1000 people weekly, by registering more people to our database and mailing list.**
- **Run dedicated Young Adult events and opportunities, helping university leavers progress into impactful voluntary roles.**
- **Connect more skilled professionals with Trustee and Governance roles, supporting a vital aspect of charity infrastructure.**
- **Help Volunteer Managers to train and support volunteers working with vulnerable people.**
- **Promote Volunteering as a lifeline to those not in Education, Employment, or Training.**
